We at Circle City Clubhouse, as part of the worldwide Clubhouse community, stand with Clubhouse International in expressing our outrage at the killing of George Floyd and our rejection of systemic racism.

At Circle City Clubhouse, we believe that all people have value and need a space where they are welcomed and needed. We strive to be a safe space and community for all people recovering from mental illnesses regardless of their race, gender, ethnicity, religion, national origin, sexual or gender identity, or disability. The killing of George Floyd is one of many examples of how our society devalues people who are marginalized, and we recognize that Black Americans in particular have long been unjustly killed and mistreated without consequence.

Circle City Clubhouse is committed to being a community that stands against racism and discrimination in all of its forms, that advocates for justice for those who are disempow-

## Clubhouse Reopening



Starting on Monday, June 8th, Circle City Clubhouse began re-opening its building and work-ordered day program for our full normal hours, 8:30 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. In an effort to maintain the safety of our members, Circle City Clubhouse is initially limiting attendance to 10 members per day, and we will ask members to call Clubhouse ahead of time at 317-260-8058 to sign up for which days they want to come in. For the time being, we are not providing transportation in

Clubhouse vans and will ask members to arrange for Medicaid transportation through Southeast Trans or to otherwise obtain transportation to and from Clubhouse.

We have re-organized our Clubhouse to encourage members to keep a six foot distance from each other, and will be taking the following precautions. All members, staff, and visitors will be screened for symptoms of COVID-19 and have their temperatures taken when they arrive at Clubhouse. We are asking that people remain at home if they have any Covid-19 symptoms, and will ask individuals to leave if they arrive at Clubhouse with a fever or active symptoms. We are also requiring members, staff, and visitors to wear masks at all times while they are in the Clubhouse, maintain a distance of six feet from other individuals, and follow good personal hygiene (such as washing hands with soap for 20 seconds).

To stay connected with people who may not be able to attend in person, members will be able to call in or connect to all Clubhouse meetings via Zoom. The meeting information is posted on the Circle City Clubhouse Facebook page, or members can get the information by calling Clubhouse. We will also be continuing meal delivery two days per week to mem-

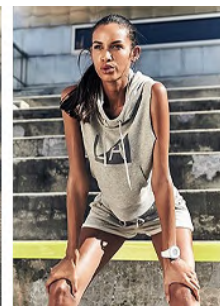
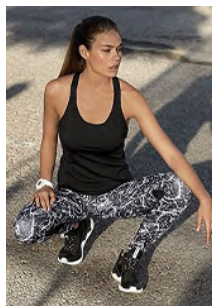

What do you like to do for fun?

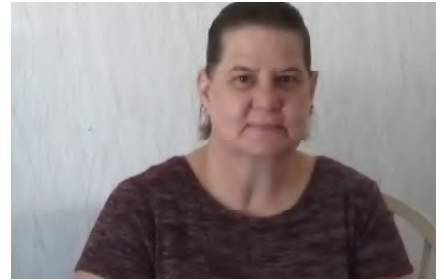
Spend time with my family and shopping.
