WHY DO WE CELEBRATE LABOR DAY?

Labor Day is a time to celebrate the contributions and achievements of American workers and is traditionally observed on the first Monday in September. It was created by the labor movement in the late 19th century and became a federal holiday in 1894.

In the late 1800s, during the Industrial Revolution in the United States, the average American worked 12-hour days and seven-day weeks just to make a basic living. Children as young as 5 or 6 worked in mills, factories and mines across the country, earning only a fraction of what adults were paid. People of all ages, particularly the very poor and recent immigrants, often worked in extremely unsafe working conditions, with insufficient access to fresh air, sanitary facilities and breaks.

As manufacturing increased, labor unions became established and more vocal about poor working conditions. They began organizing strikes and rallies to protest poor conditions and compel employers to renegotiate hours and pay.

On September 5, 1882, 10,000 workers took unpaid time off to march from City Hall to Union Square in New York City, holding the first Labor Day parade in U.S. history. Following this march, Congress passed an act making Labor Day a legal holiday in the District of Columbia and the territories. On June 28, 1894, President Grover Cleveland signed the holiday into law.

Labor Day is still celebrated in cities and towns across the United States with parades, picnics, barbecues, fireworks display and other public gatherings. For many Americans, particularly children and young adults, it represents the end of the summer and the start
